WHY WE GO TO KENYA

Kenya is one of the world's poorest nations, with **average earnings of around £3 per day**. At least 1.7m Kenyans have died as a result of their infection since the epidemic began, as a result around **1.2 million children have been orphaned**. HIV prevalence is currently 6.2% with around 100,000 new cases occurring annually. CWB have visited Kenya 12 times and coached over 20,000 children, over 800 adults have also trained as ICC qualified coaches.



EVA'S STORY

On the first ever CWB project, a coaching session was held at an orphanage in Kiandutu, a slum area of Nairobi. Eva was present at the orphanage that day but for some time had been too ill to get out of bed, she was receiving no treatment and was suffering from an AIDS defining condition. However, seeing so many of her friends enjoying cricket Eva belatedly joined the session and, in true CWB fashion, managed to score the winning runs and was made to feel special.
